NOTES	The word is most commonly and appropriately translated ⁽⁹⁾ some ⁽¹⁰⁾ times in the Scriptures. The word ⁽¹¹⁾ is therefore appropriately expressed as ⁽¹²⁾ , or at one-ment, or in agreement.
	The first time ⁽¹³⁾ is used in Scripture is in Genesis 15:15 " <i>Thou shalt go to thy fathers in peace</i> " (eternal peace, or a continuing rest).
	The most common expression is in Judges 19:20 "Peace be unto you" which is still the common greeting among Jewish people everywhere, as we say welcome, good morning, etc. Upon entering the home, a guest often spoke a benediction, "Peace be to thy house." (1 Samuel 25:6)
	By definition the Bible tells us that (14) is (15) "the God of Peace" or "the God that is Peace". We could say (16), (17), or (18) or (19) Because He is Peace, He naturally manifests peace.
	Shalom represented the greatest measure of contentment and satisfaction in life.
	So we see that Jehovah-Shalom is the God that makes content. Truly He satisfies, because He is Shalom. Peace! He is the answer to every question.
	The occasion of God's revelation of Himself as Jehovah-Shalom came more than 200 years after He revealed Himself to His people as Jehovah M'Kaddesh.

Gideon was comforted of the Lord in Judges 6:23, 24. "Peace be unto thee; fear not", and so Gideon called the place, Jehovah-Shalom, the (30)

Jehovah is, or sends, peace. This implies that peace for the individual and for the nation can only be found in returning to Jehovah, and that Jehovah alone is the author and giver of peace, because Jehovah-Shalom Himself is peace.	
Gideon's name for Jehovah, implying peace is not something, but rather someone; not a virtue, but a person.	
In the New Testament, Gideon's description is personified in Romans 15:33, Hebrews 13:20 and numerous other references as

Just as Christ is our (35), so is Christ our (36)	
Christ not only preached peace, and made peace by His shed blood, but He Himself is peace. Peace for us, then, is not a feeling or experience, but rather a possession of peace through Christ, not merely an attribute, but He Himself, "My peace I give unto you…"

	If we believe in Him as Jehovah-Jireh, "The LORD will provide", if we realized Jehovah-Rophi, "The Lord my healer", if we have taken in the force of Jehovah-Nissi, "The LORD my banner", if we have experienced Him as Jehovah M'Kaddesh, "The LORD my sanctifier", then we ought to boldly say Jehovah-Shalom, "The LORD my peace."

Salvation is the result of redemption, which is the payment of debt that satisfies or appeases the outstanding judgment. Sin separates man from God. Through Christ's atoning sacrifice, sin's penalty is paid. The debt is now covered. There is no longer "againstness". God is not against redeemed sinners. Peace is the result of satisfying sin's debt and only through Christ can sin's debt be paid! In Him is perfect peace — a cessation of "againstness". (Romans 5:1, 10; 2 Corinthians 5:19)
