"The LORD is my Shepherd; I shall not want. He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters. He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake." ~Psalm 23:1-3

David is testifying that <sup>(1)</sup> is his	NOTES
The word translated <sup>(3)</sup> is, as we have already learned, <sup>(4)</sup> , one of our primary names of God in the Old Testament.	·
According to Thomas Newberry's word study, the name <sup>(5)</sup> combines the three tenses of the Hebrew verb "to be": Yehi, "He will be" (the future); Hove, "being" (the present); and Hayah, "He was" (the past).	
We take the primary letters of Yehi/YEH, the middle two letters of Hove/OV, and the last two letters of Hahyah/AH, and we have YEH-OV-AH/JEHOVAH!	
The title that describes God as the One Who is, was, and always will be, the <sup>(6)</sup> God!	
ROHI – " <i>RO'EH</i> " – The primary meaning of this word is to feed or lead to pasture, as a Shepherd does his flock.	
The incident that brings about this revelation of God in the name Jehovah-ROHI is really the result of the experiences of God's people on their pilgrimage through the promises of God.	
God has been revealing Himself to his people through each of their experiences in a very definite and divine order.

	<ul> <li>2. JEHOVAH – absolute self-existent One; God of Salvation;</li> <li>Eternal, ever-loving One.</li> <li>(Exodus 3:14-15)</li> </ul>
	3. <b>EL-SHADDAI</b> —God Almighty—All Sufficient One; Source and supply; He is all that you ever need. <i>(Genesis 17:1)</i>
	4. <b>ADONAI</b> – Master, Owner; Authority. ( <i>Genesis 15:2</i> )
	5. <b>JEHOVAH-JIREH</b> – The Lord will provide – He sees and provides; the God of Provision. <i>(Genesis 22:1-14)</i>
	6. <b>JEHOVAH-ROPHE</b> — The Lord that heals; physician. ( <i>Exodus 15:22-26</i> )
	7. <b>JEHOVAH-NISSI</b> – The Lord our Banner; Standard; He who goes before. ( <i>Exodus 17: 11-15</i> )
	8. <b>JEHOVAH-M'KADDESH</b> – The Lord who sanctifies; the Lord who makes holy. The God who separates. ( <i>Leviticus 20:7-8</i> )
	9. <b>JEHOVAH-SHALOM</b> – The Lord our peace, contented. ( <i>Judges 6:23-24</i> )
	10. <b>JEHOVAH-TSEBAOTH</b> – The Lord of hosts, Lord of Lords. ( <i>Psalms 89:6-8</i> )
	The people of God have learned much about who God is, and they have seen the LORD is great in life, in healing, in victory, in holiness, in peace, and in protection, but they are still pilgrims in need of divine direction and provision on the journey.

## Schovah Rohi

These people know shepherding; they know sheep; they know the responsibility of the shepherd and the needs of the sheep.

David was a shepherd. He knew the heart of the message that the Holy Spirit was convincing him to pen. What a description of this attribute of God.

Literally, the God who leads, and the God who feeds. It means to care for the sheep of His fold.

Feeder	Genesis 4:2	The LORD is the feeder
Companion	Proverbs 28:7	To provide, keeper
Friend	Judges 14:20	To protect; companion to
Pastor	Jeremiah 17:16	Cheer; friend to help; pastor to
Herdsman	Genesis 13:7	Comfort, herdsman to gather
Shepherd	Psalm 23:1	The shepherd to lead

The Hebrew word is translated into English as Shepherd, which occurs about 80 times in the Bible. The same word often used in the Hebrew is also translated Pastor.

In the New Testament, the Greek word *poimen* is Shepherd. In the Old Testament the priests, prophets, and kings were referred to as pastors or under shepherds—leaders of God's people. (*Jeremiah 3:15; 2 Samuel 5:2; Isaiah 44:28; Ezekiel 34:2, 8, 10*)

The title refers to those who have authority over, and who willingly care for those entrusted to them.

Our JEHOVAH is <sup>(7)</sup>\_\_\_\_\_, not <sup>(8)</sup>\_\_\_\_\_, but <sup>(9)</sup>\_\_\_\_\_. He will lead; He will guide; He will direct; *"where God guides, He provides,"* because He is <sup>(10)</sup>\_\_\_\_\_.

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NOTES	David affirms the fact that <sup>(11)</sup> is <sup>(12)</sup> Here we have the personal pronoun of possession (Jehovah is my Shepherd – <i>Psalm 23:1</i> ) <b>JEHOVAH IS THE SHEPHERD OF ISRAEL,</b> <b>BUT HE MUST ALSO BE MADE A PERSONAL SHEPHERD!</b> There is a vital connection between Psalms 22 and 23. Psalm 22 is the <u>Psalm of the Saviour</u> – Calvary Psalm.
	Psalm 23 is the <u>Psalm of the Shepherd</u> – Rod & Staff. WE CANNOT LIVE 23 UNLESS WE HAVE EXPERIENCED 22.
