| NOTES | In Isaiah 38:20 the (II) of God in daily life, or His (I2) activity and oversight on behalf of His own is seen. Hezekiah found not only (I3) I Am, but also compounded I AM and present I AM.  Jah identifies as a compound a message about God:  Jehonathan — Jonathan — Yahweh has given, Jehovah gives.  Jehoshaphat — Yahweh has judged, Jehovah has judged.  Elijah — Yahweh is God, God is Jehovah.  Abijah — Whose father is Jehovah. |
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|       | Compounding (14) identifies the presence of God in the life of the individual. The most often remembered and expressed compound is "Praise ye Jah" or Halle-lu-jah—"Praise ye the LORD." The same in every language!   |
|       | From the manifold use of JAH in the Psalms, we find God extolled as the One who rideth upon the heavens, Father of the fatherless, Judge of widows, and an ever present help. JAH is ever, a very present help in trouble. ( <i>Psalm 46:1</i> )   |
