

"THE FIRST AND THE LAST"

"I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the ending, saith the Lord, which is, and which was, and which is to come, the Almighty." ~Revelation 1:8

$^{(1)}$ is the first letter of the Greek alphabet, $^{(2)}$,	
and corresponds with the Hebrew (3)	NOTES
is used with the last letter of the Greek alphabet, in the expression "Alpha and Omega, the first and the last," which is applied to the Father or Christ. (Revelation 1:8, 1:11, 21:6, 22:13)	
The Hebrews, the Greeks, and the Romans all used their alphabetical letters as numerals, and that helped to establish the first letter and last letter numerically Alpha=first, Omega=last.	
The meaning is explained in the context "the beginning" (6) and "the end" (7), "the first" (8) and "the last" (9)	
As (10), first born, (Colossians 1:15) He is preeminent over all who will follow, or be born after. In Revelation, (11) indicates that He is the one who brought all things into existence, and (12) is the one who will bring them to their determined end. (2 Peter 3:10-13; Revelation 21:1) This expression is directly identifiable of God the Father or Jesus Christ. (John 1:3; Romans 11:36; Ephesians 1:10; Revelation 3:14)	
signifies the eternal creative existence of God. (<i>Isaiah 44:6</i>) This name of God in the New Testament is identifiably the same as the name of God in the Old Testament and (15)	
(Isaiah 41:4, 43:10-15, 44:6, 45:8, 21-22)	

NOTES	Isaiah is reminding us of the first and most basic truth in Scripture "; not ","" is God. The Scriptures never explain it, they simply contain it. In the beginning (18); before there was anything else, there was God.
	Isaiah reminds us there is only (19); there is only (20) who created, and He was here before as (21), first, and He will be here after which is (22), last.
	Genesis 1:1, John 1:1-4, and Revelation 3:14 reveal the basic truth that God is (23)"" or origin of all creation.
	As (24) (the first) He is (25), creator of all things. (<i>John 1:1-10; Hebrews 1:10</i>) As Alpha and Omega, He is the of all creation. (<i>Colossians 1:15-17</i>)
	makesitclear that He is the (28) one (Colossians 1:18-19), and His name is above every name (Philippians 2:9-11) because He has all authority. (Matthew 28:18; Ephesians 1:9-22)
	— (29) tells us that God is the point where everything concludes. (<i>Revelation 1:18-22, 12:13</i>) (30) tells us that God is the final authority (<i>John 14:6</i>) and that all creation will account to Him. (<i>Revelation 14:11-12</i>)
	He is the eternal cause of all things, and He is the final destination at which all things arrive.
	To our understanding, Alpha and Omega is like saying from A to Z. All 26 letters of the alphabet, and all they do or say. (Jesus Christ is the Word of God) (<i>John 1:1-4</i>)

Illustration: Luke 11:51 inclusive: This name totally encompasses	
all that God is and all that He will accomplish. In this name is the	NOTES
total sum of all the names of God in the Old Testament and New	
Testament.	
Illustration: The scene in Revelation is similar to that of Isaiah.	
God's people are divided; sin is rampant; confusion, idolatry, and	
wickedness is on every hand; and God reveals Himself to His	
people and proclaims their accountability to Him.	
The Old Testament (31) and (32) is inclusive.	
There is no other, and God identifies Himself as (33)	
first, and (34) last. The Old Testament prophets	
recorded the truth that there was no other. The New Testament	
first and (36) last, is also	
inclusive. There is no other God, and Jesus Christ describes	
Himself as (37) = first, and	
(38) = last or final.	
In both accounts, God is identified as (39)	
El-Shaddai. (Genesis 17:1; Isaiah 41:4; Revelation 1:8, 4:8-11) The	
term "The Almighty" occurs only ten times in the New Testament,	
and nine of these are in Revelation. The first time it is used in the	
Bible is in 1 Samuel 1:3. Elkanah worshipped "The Lord of Hosts."	
Jehovah of Hosts, the Almighty (none above, beside, none else).	
Genesis reveals the $^{(40)}$, the $^{(41)}$ Revelation	
reveals the $^{(42)}$, the $^{(43)}$, and all that is	
encompassed between from the beginning until the end.

NOTES	1. In (44) we see God	
	is ⁽⁴⁵⁾ Literally, Jesus Christ is God's	
	alphabet - all wisdom, power, etc. Jesus is all things and knows	
	all things—nothing is left out. No wonder He is called the Word of God!

	2. In (46) we see God is	
	Here it is stated in terms of time, but it	
	is just as true in terms of space. (Matthew 18:20, 28:20)	
	"I am the Lord which is, and which was, and which is to	
	come, the Almighty."	
	3. In (48) we see God is	
	, here speaking of Christ and clearly	
	identifying Him as (50)"". Again, there	
	is only one "Almighty", only one (51), and only one (52)	
	These three attributes are each inclusive. There can only be one	
all-knowing, one all-places, and one all-powerful. These testi		
	the deity of Jesus Christ.	
	Old Testament or New, God has clearly defined that "Almighty	
	God" is the first and the last. There is none other. God reveals this	
	truth through the revelation of Jesus Christ. When Jesus spoke	
	to the scribes and Pharisees in the Gospel of John, He identified	
	Himself as " <i>I AM</i> ", and of a truth Christ is all-compassing. I AM	
	the door; I AM the bread of life; I AM the way, the truth, and the	
	life. Whatever we need, He is – present tense. Alpha: He always	
	has been; Omega: He always will be. There is none before, beside,	
	or beyond. He is the first and the last!
